## Milestones

- ❖ We partnered with ICampus Liberia, the Irish Embassy Monrovia, and the British Embassy Monrovia to build the first inclusion cafe in Liberia.
- ❖ We established a year around paid fellowship program (work readiness) for young individuals in the Liberian disabled community.
- ❖ Through our partnership, we were able to build numerous prostheses, provide counseling services, physical therapy, school assistance, and much more to the young amputees we serve.
- ❖ We were able to provide bone trimming surgery to three young amputees, including a bilateral amputee.
- ❖ Our radio program audience increased as well as our radio team members.
- ❖ We established three new partners.
- ❖ We established two new school clubs at our partnered schools for the deaf.
- ❖ We added one new school for the deaf to our school club partners.
- ❖ Our school clubs impacted over 100 students at Liberian schools for the deaf.
- ❖ Through our partnership, we were able to renovate two orphanage home, and school for young people with profound hearing loss.
